Specific Duties and Responsibilities

- Teach, manage, and work alongside volunteers in all phases of construction from foundation forming to finish work.
- Bolster and improve green-building practices via hands-on work and active feedback to HFH East Bay staff.
- Organize and repair tools and materials on large new-home construction sites as well as scattered-site rehab homes.
- Pick up materials, supplies, and lumber and run other related errands.

Education, Experience, Knowledge, Skills, and Abilities

Construction experience, teaching background, and design or engineering skills are useful but not required. Positive attitude and desire to work with lots of people is a must!

Work Environment/Physical Requirements

Must be able to perform manual labor on active construction sites and be able to lift 50 pounds.
